

# **ST JOHN'S FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE**

## **OPERATING GUIDELINES (2010)**

- 1. The Foundation may award educational scholarship(s) to college students each year in an amount determined by the recommendation of the Scholarship Committee and approved by the Foundation Board.**
- 2. The Educational Student Scholarship(s) are generously sponsored by the Romness and Gustavson families and the St. John's Foundation Board.**
- 3. The Scholarship(s) may be awarded each year at the Foundation's discretion and shown as a separate line item in the Foundation budget.**
- 4. The Scholarships will be awarded based on merit.**
- 5. Applicants must be a member or the child of a member of St. John's Lutheran Church of Mound.**
- 6. Direct family members of the Foundation Board and the St. John's clergy are not eligible for these Scholarships.**
- 7. Applicants should be enrolled as a junior or Senior in a post secondary school pursuing a career in the "helping" professions such as medical services, police, fire, social work, teaching, etc, .or the ministry.**
- 8. Applicants must fill out an application for the Scholarship(s) accompanied by a short written narrative explaining their education goal and how the scholarship will assist the applicant in meeting those goals.**
- 9. Applications must be received by the Foundation Board Scholarship Committee on or before April 15<sup>th</sup>.**
- 10. A Subcommittee of the Foundation Board, the Scholarship Committee, will review applications and make its recommendation to the Board as to its choice of the scholarship recipient(s) and the amount of each scholarship.**

11. The Scholarship recipients will be advised that they have been chosen to receive a scholarship and the amount of the scholarship after the Board has acted, usually at its May meeting each year. The Scholarships will be formally awarded in June in Church each year for the fall semester.
  12. The award could be made to the same applicant for **not more than two successive** years, at the **discretion of the Foundation Board**.
